A team of school professionals including teachers, psychologists, physical therapists, counselors, and others will meet with you to discuss how we can best create a welcoming learning environment for your child. Together we will determine if your child is eligible for free special education services, supports, and programs.

A Comparable Service Plan (CSP) will be created for your child by the new school or the Committee on Special Education (CSE), using information shared by you or the Family Welcome Center. This plan will ensure immediate support for your child.

Once your child is attending school, a team will begin the evaluation process for a formal Individualized Education Program (IEP). You will be asked for written consent for evaluations, so providers can determine the most appropriate supports, programs, and services. Together you will create a personalized plan to ensure your child has full and equal access to public education.
