LOCATION:

Various sites throughout New York City (scoring locations for each exam are listed here (open external link) Accepted applicants will be assigned to the scoring site closest to their work location, as permitted by capacity. There will be one or more scoring sites for each exam across all five boroughs.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

New York City Department of Education currently appointed EAs, Principals, and Assistant Principals.

- Applicants with an unsatisfactory or ineffective rating in the 2020-2021 or 2019-2020 school year are not eligible to be selected for this activity.
- Applicants who have received an unsatisfactory rating for an Office of Assessment per session activity are not eligible to be selected for this activity.
- Applicants will be required to work in person for the duration of the assignment.

SELECTION CRITERIA:

All candidates must:

- Be available to attend the full training and scoring commitment for the particular NYS Regents exam, as indicated in the table above and/or scheduled by the Scoring Site Supervisor. Training or scoring which occurs on school days will start between 4:30

^{*} Dates listed above do not include a mandatory, 3 hour borough-based training session scheduled for January 12 or 13 depending on borough assignment. The location of the training session will be communicated to all selected personnel upon being offered the position. Training location will be in the same borough as the assigned site, not the current place of work, and all training takes place after the regular work day.

and 5:00pm; training or scoring which takes place on Saturday or Sunday will start at 8:30am. See <u>THIS LINK</u> for the expected scoring schedule.

- _Note: Accepted applicants who are absent from training or scoring, arrive at the scoring site late, fail to apply the
 rubric, or fail to adhere to the test security protocols outlined HERE may be released from the assignment.
- Be currently scheduled as the primary or secondary teacher of a high-school level course (based on STARS data) which aligns to the related NYS Regents exam or NYSED-approved Regents alternative (as per NYSED code description) and be appointed under a license in the content area of the exam.
 - o Or be currently scheduled as the primary teacher of a high-school level course (based on STARS data) which aligns to the related NYS Regents exam or NYSED-approved Regents alternative (as per NYSED code description).
 - Or be currently appointed under a license in the content area of the exam related to the position and teach at the high school level (based on STARS data).
- Demonstrate ability/experience in effectively engaging an audience when delivering professional development trainings.
- Demonstrate ability to lead trainings for scorers, including:
 - o Providing clear guidance on application of the scoring rubric to student responses.
 - Clarifying by responding to inquiries related to scoring.
 - Monitoring scoring to assure that protocols are being followed.

PREFERENCE WILL BE GIVEN TO CANDIDATES WHO:

- Have been appointed to the Content Trainer position during January 2022 day scoring.
- Have been nominated by a January 2022 Site Supervisor to serve as a Content Trainer for January 2022 per session scoring.
 - Nominations must be submitted directly to Office of Assessment and must be received by 11:59pm on December 10,
 2021 to receive consideration.
- Hold fluency (reading abilities, writing abilities, speaking abilities, oral and written translation abilities, and familiarity with academic vocabulary) in one or more foreign languages (including but not limited to Arabic, Bengali, Chinese, Haitian/Creole, Korean, Russian, Spanish, and Urdu). Note: This applies for Algebra I, Algebra II, Chemistry, Earth Science, Geometry, Global History, Living Environment, Physics, and US History positions ONLY.

DUTIES/RESPONSIBILITIES:

Content Trainers will:

- Attend a borough-based training session and a planning session outside of scoring hours (determined by Site Supervisors, consistent with date ranges above). The time and location of the training session will be communicated to all selected personnel upon being offered the position.
- Assist with coordination of the scoring activities.
- Prepare for scoring using DOE materials and NYSED rating guide.
- Create scoring committees in collaboration with the Site Supervisor and/or Organizational Team Lead. Assign table leaders.
- Train scorers and provide support for scorers during scoring.
- Monitor and maintain scoring rates.
- Escalate cases of suspected cheating, materials discrepancies, and sensitive papers to Site Supervisor and/or Organizational Team Lead (when necessary).
- Assist with scoring (whenever possible).

OP-175: 2021-2022 Chancellor's Regulation C-175

Summary of Chancellor's Regulation C-175

Chancellor's Regulation C-175 is available for review at https://www.schools.nyc.gov/about-us/policies/chancellors-regulations. Each school maintains a copy of the Standard Operating Procedures Manual for Schools (SOPM). Individuals may review a copy of these procedures in order to familiarize themselves with the process by which per session employees are processed and paid.

- 1. All per session employees must complete an application for per session activity (OP175) prior to commencing service.
- 2. Individuals who have been approved for waivers in prior years must resubmit new waiver applications each year. For this purpose, the per session year is from July 1 *through* June 30.
- 3. Individuals must submit a waiver form for exceeding the limit on the maximum number of hours that can be served in a per session year. The maximum number of hours of per session work that may be performed annually is available in the C-175 regulation.
- 4. No individual is authorized to work in a per session activity during a normal school workday.
- 5. Per session employment, whether funded from the same or a different source, may not be used as a means of providing additional compensation for work similar to that which is performed in an individual's primary assignment.
- 6. Individuals cannot serve in a per session activity for which, in their primary assignment, they are responsible for hiring, rating, or coordinating or which they normally supervise in their primary assignment.
- 7. No per session compensation may be paid for work performed at home.
- 8. Employees on sabbatical leaves beginning August 1 must complete per session activities in which they are serving in July. They will not be permitted to commence any new per session assignments until the September following the completion of the sabbatical.
- 9. Each per session employee is required to use a time clock to record the exact time of arrival and departure. The timecard is to be maintained at the work site and should serve as the basis of entries on the Personnel Time Report. If a time clock is not available, a daily attendance report with exact time of arrival and departure must be provided, maintained and approved by a supervisor. In every case, regardless of the specific manner in which time is reported, supervisors are accountable for verifying the record of attendance. Approval by a co-worker is not acceptable. Failure to maintain satisfactory records will result in the withholding of compensation or recoupment of payment already made.
- 10. Each per session employee is required to submit a time sheet for service that was performed during the prior per session period within one school day of the per session period immediately following each service.
- 11. Time sheets submitted for per session work which required a waiver that was not previously approved will result in the withholding of per session payment.
- 12. If a teacher is entitled to retention rights in a per session activity but fails to claim those rights before or at the time of application for a different per session job in which the teacher has no retention rights, the teacher may then be denied employment in the job for which there is entitlement to retention.

Notes: Requests for waivers must be submitted sufficiently in advance to allow time for review and appropriate action. Failure to obtain a valid waiver may result in the withholding of payment for hours worked beyond the maximum hours as outlined in Chancellor's Regulation C-175.
